Planting in the Fall/Winter

Many people believe it is better that you plant your landscape palms in the spring/summer only. Though this may sound legitimate to many, we believe there are actually some advantages in planting in the winter months.

For instance, because the sun is so far down on the horizon, it is good to begin to acclimate your palms to full sun; since many potted palms, tropicals, and subtropicals are usually accustomed to a shade house environment.

Some growers believe that the soils are too cold to allow palms to begin growing. Let's face it – a lot of palms don't like too much cold weather. However, we must remember that spring is just around the corner, in a few days, the solstice will be completed, and the days are going to get longer. (A good root stimulator will help ensure that your roots are getting a head start; so that when the warmer months come, your palms will not only be better acclimated to full sun, but will have a healthy root system.)

Remember, south-facing areas still get plenty of sun and warmth during our SoCal winters.
